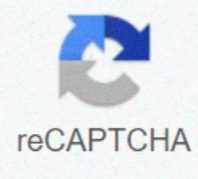




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Amana washer repair manual

If you have a question about how to operate your washer or dryer or why it isn't working correctly, the first place to look for answers is by reading the operating manual or checking the manufacturer's website. You'll find the instructions on how to use the washing machine or dryer, correct maintenance information, and some solutions for troubleshooting problems. There are two types of manuals—operating and repair. Most retailers and manufacturers only include the operating manual with the sale of the appliance. If you are handy with tools, you can purchase the repair manual that will guide you through wiring and mechanical systems. It should also offer diagnostic symbols and tools to determine what is wrong with internal computers. To find the correct manual, you must know the manufacturer and model number of your washer or dryer. The information can be found on a sticker on the back of the machine or just inside the appliance door. You can use the same guidelines to find a manual for any type of large or small household appliance. If you have tossed or misplaced your operating manual, visit ManualsOnline.com, ManualMania.com or Manual Owl to get a replacement. Most offer free PDFs of the manual you can download or replacement manuals for a small fee. You can also visit the manufacturer's site directly for downloadable or online manuals. The sites will also offer you information on recalls on appliance models and most provide answers to frequently asked questions. Some of the washer and dryer manufacturers and some sites that offer operating manuals also offer repair manuals if you are a do-it-yourselfer tackling a washer or dryer repair. There are repair manuals available for many brands for a small fee. If you have basic mechanical skills, these are less costly than calling a professional. Replacing fuses, damaged power cords or repairing leaks can be quite simple. The repair or technical manual includes diagrams of the electrical systems, lists of replacement parts and diagnostic testing schedules. These are the same manuals that professional repair technicians use for new laundry appliances. The Repair Clinic and Appliance Repair websites are an excellent resource for the manual or replacement parts if you plan to do the repairs yourself. You can also purchase replacement parts directly from some manufacturers, home hardware stores and online from Amazon. When your high-efficiency front-loading washing machine Duet washer or dryer stops working, many issues are simple to diagnose and can be repaired with just a few tools and some easy instructions. Then, you can decide whether to call a technician and pay for a repair call and parts or try your hand at repairing the problem yourself. Problem: Water accumulates in the bottom of the Duet Washer drum between loads of laundry. Since the water is appearing after the washer has successfully completed a cycle, the problem could be with the washer or with the drainage lines. If the standing water is clear and clean, it is probably accumulating due to a failed inlet valve on the washer. Turn off the hot and cold water sources completely (or disconnect the hoses) after doing a load of laundry and wait a few hours to see if the problem happens. If no water accumulates, then the problem is being caused by the inlet valve leaking water and a valve repair or replacement is needed. If you need a user or repair manual, you can find it here and replacement parts here. If some water does appear in the drum with the water sources turned off and it is soapy, then it is a drainage (plumbing) problem. What you are seeing is drain water backing up into your washer from the drainage system. Be sure the washer's drain hose is not inserted too far down the standpipe. It should only be inserted about six to eight inches. A severe clog in the drainage line could also cause a back-up of drainage water that seeps back into the washer. When the repair is complete, be sure to give your washer a good cleaning to help prevent the growth of mold that can cause odor issues. Problem: The door latch only works intermittently. If the door won't lock, the washer won't run. First, try giving it a good cleaning. Use a cotton swab dipped in rubbing alcohol to clean the latch and any contact points. This will remove the lint, dirt, and product build-up that may be interfering with the electrical circuit. The lock/lock motor is easy to replace if you are handy with repairs. These locks have a wax motor that can wear out with frequent use and misuse. It is much less expensive to replace the door latch yourself than to call a repair technician. Problem: Duet Washer door will not unlock at the end of a complete cycle. Before you pry off the door and cause extensive damage, follow these steps: Unplug the washer or disconnect power. Remove the lower kick panel. Reach up along the inside of the front and locate the bottom of the door switch/lock unit. Located on the bottom of the door switch/lock unit is a tear-drop shaped tab. Gently pull the tab down about a 1/4-inch or until a click is heard. The door can then be opened. If the problem happens again, the door lock/latch should be replaced. Problem: Whirlpool Duet Dryer won't start a cycle Always check that the dryer is receiving the proper amount of 240v current. Be sure it is plugged in and check for tripped circuits. The dryer will not start if the door latch is malfunctioning. It may just need to be cleaned to remove lint and residue so that full contact is achieved or it may need to be replaced. Clean it by dipping a cotton swab in rubbing alcohol and cleaning all the contact points. Inspect the thermal fuse. If it is blown (The glass housing will have turned dark in color.), the dryer will not start as a precaution to prevent overheating. Fuses are simple to replace. Finally, check the start switch with a voltage meter. If it is not performing properly, it should be replaced. When it is repaired, make sure you are getting the best results from your dryer. It also offers two wash options, three soil levels and five water temperatures, which is on the small side for a range of wash selections.The cycles you get are fairly basic, including heavy, regular, bulky, quick wash and casual. You also get a deep-water wash for when you need extra water in the washtub and a clean-washer cycle to help keep your machine free of soap scum and bacteria. If you prefer a machine with Energy Star certification, consider the Samsung WA50R5400AW.The Amana NTW4516FW may be one of the smallest machines we compared, but it's still fine for most loads, although you probably won't be able to wash your comforter in it.Amana NTW4516FW: User reviews This is a pretty popular model amongst users, scoring an average of 4.5 out of 5. Many note that it's mostly quiet but the odd review noted that it could be a bit noisy when washing bulky items. Most importantly, users loved the performance, with clothes coming out really clean even on high efficiency, low detergent settings. The auto-sensing feature is also particularly popular, allowing the machine to save water when the drum isn't as full, helping to save on water bills. A few reviews did note that the auto-sensing feature didn't always work for them, but this only seemed to apply to a small number of users.Should you buy the Amana NTW4516FW? The Amana NTW4516FW is a rather basic model that relies on more traditional technology, but it does a good job and is one of the cheaper models on the market. The small capacity is likely to be a big drawback for large families or those that often wash bulky items, who may need to pay a bit more for that extra capacity.It isn't Energy Star certified so it could have a bit more of an impact on bills than other models, but the auto-sensing feature should mitigate some of the extra cost.
